

Material List for Adult Oil and Acrylic Painting Class
Fall 2008

Oil/Acrylic paints in the following colors:

Titanium white

Black

Burnt Sienna,

Sap Green

Cerulean Blue

Cadmium Yellow-light or medium

Cadmium Red, medium

Raw Umber

Brushes: Teacher Recommendations include Princeton brush brand for greater quality. Have at least one of the following: small round brush (Size 4 is good), filbert brush (size 8 is good), one liner brush for details, one fan brush, one angular brush in a 1/2" width. This is a great starting point for beginners who need just a few brushes to start with.

Painting surfaces: Your choice of preference for what you paint on. With acrylic painting you can use watercolor paper that's at least 90lbs. Canvases are great for acrylics and oils, and artist boards also referred to as canvas panels are very inexpensive and are a happy medium between the two.

Painting with oils; make sure to have Mineral spirits to clean out your brushes with, and linseed oil. Linseed oil increases the brilliance and transparency of colors, and helps to eliminate brush strokes when mixed into your oil paints.
