

Acknowledgement of Maricopa County Air Quality Department Regulations for Demolition and Renovation

I have been advised of Maricopa County's air quality regulations for demolition and renovation, and I have received a copy of the handout entitled, **Asbestos NESHAP Regulations for Demolition and Renovation**, which is published by Maricopa County's Air Quality Department.

I understand that the performance of any building demolition, including the removal or renovation of interior walls, or the disturbance of friable asbestos-containing materials may be classified as "Regulated Asbestos". Regulated Asbestos requires:

- A completed *NESHAP Notification for Renovation and Demolition Activities* form (10-Day NESHAP Notification) must be submitted to the Maricopa County Air Quality Department for each project at least 10 working days prior to commencement of the renovation/demolition work **and**
- The building must have been inspected for the presence of asbestos by an AHERA certified inspector within the past year preceding the submittal of the completed *NESHAP Notification for Renovation and Demolition Activities* form.

I understand that the Maricopa County Air Quality Department enforces its regulations and that failure to comply with the County's asbestos regulations may result in project delays or penalties.

Definitions:

AHERA – Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act

NESHAP – National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants pursuant to 40 CFR Part 61, Subpart M (1990)

Friable – Any material that, when dry, can be crumbled, pulverized, or reduced to powder by hand pressure

Regulated Asbestos – Amount of friable asbestos-containing material is 160 square feet, 260 linear feet (piping systems only), 35 cubic feet, or greater

Renovation – Altering a facility or one or more facility components in any way, including but not limited to Additions, Alterations, Tenant Improvements and Repair of Fire Damage
