## BIKE. PARK. SHOWER. GO!

The first facility of its kind in Arizona, The Bicycle Cellar is a full service bicycle shop that will offer secure bicycle parking and related services to make cyclists' lives easier. Services include repairs, equipment and accessory sales, bicycle advice and education, bicycle rentals and restrooms and changing rooms. The Bicycle Cellar will offer daily, weekly, monthly and yearly membership plans. Members will have access to the facility from 4AM to midnight, seven days a week. The Bicycle Cellar is an integral element of the **Tempe Transportation Center**, which provides connections to the METRO light rail, bus routes, popular bikeway corridors and trail linkages to Hayden Butte. Approximately 2,000 square feet of the Transportation Center will be dedicated for bike parking and related services. Opens August 24th. [see attached flyer]

Scottsdale Road, Tempe, on Aug. 20 and plan to add 15 locations throughout the Greater Phoenix Metropolitan Area within five years. The Mostafavi brothers will host 'Dollar Burrito Night' on Aug. 25 so customers can sample Panchero's trademark burritos for just \$1 from 4-6PM. Panchero's Mexican Grill is a quick-serve, fresh-Mexican franchise that serves its signature fresh-pressed tortillas. Burritos are customized and mixed with "Bob the Tool" to get every ingredient in every bite. The menu also includes quesadillas, tacos, burrito bowls, and salads. The brand was founded in 1992 by **Rodney L. Anderson** and his father, **Thomas R. Anderson**, in Coralville, IA, where the Mostafavis first tried the restaurant. Panchero's currently has more than 50 locations in the United States and the company plans to have 65 restaurants open across the country by 2010.
