PROGRESS AT THE EISENDRATH HOUSE

Concept planning and architectural research for the rehabilitation of the **Eisendrath House**, 1400 North College, have been completed. A detailed cost estimate is now being prepared. The historic house is projected as the focal point of the **Carl Hayden Center for Sustainability**, with the capability to accommodate offices, exhibits, meetings, classes and special events. A project information sign [left] was installed during the week prior to the Super Bowl and FBR Open. Rehabilitation construction is anticipated to begin later in the year.
