KEEPING TEMPE'S WATER SAFE

As we head into the winter rainy season, it's important to take extra care to keep our stormwater drainage system free of harmful pollutants. Rainwater that doesn't get absorbed into the ground is considered stormwater runoff. In Tempe, most runoff ends up in the city's underground stormwater drainage system, which ultimately carries the untreated water to our urban lakes, rivers, parks and, in some cases, eventually to our drinking water aquifers.



We can all keep our Tempe water safe for use through reducing stormwater pollution by:

- Cleaning up after pets
- Refraining from feeding wild animals at waterside locations
- Avoiding the use of pesticides, fungicides and algacides whenever possible, especially right before rainy weather
- Using pool treatment products that contain no copper or minimal amounts and keeping all water from pools, fountains and spas on properties
- Washing vehicles at a commercial car wash that retains pollutants or in a location that doesn't drain to the street
- Never disposing of automotive fluids in storm drains
- Reporting illegal dumping

for the special needs community to participate in recreational and social activities and include Special Olympics Team Tempe, Buddy Bowling, Camp Challenge, Fabulous Friday Dances and many more.

The desert-style plunge is hosted by The Lakes Women's Club and Team ASA. Team ASA is a non-profit organization that provides financial support for children and adults with unique physical or mental challenges, enabling them to



join clubs, organizations and leagues that foster a sense of self, a sense of team, and an extended family. From bowling with friends on Saturday mornings, to swimming the third leg for his team's relay, to taking home Special Olympics Arizona's "Most Inspirational Athlete" award for Team Tempe at the Fall 2008 games, Asa Lynn Draper radiated positivity, light and sportsmanship. PROJECT CONNECT BRINGS TOGETHER COMMUNITIES FOR THOSE IN NEED



In partnership with [Valley of the Sun United Way](#) and [Sun Valley Community Church](#), Tempe held a [Project Connect](#) on Thursday, Dec. 19. Project Connect is a Valley of the Sun United Way initiative that brings together communities and organizations to provide resources for those struggling during these hard economic times.

At Project Connect, individuals and families who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness are connected to more than 30 health and human service providers to accomplish a series of personal goals that empower them

on their road to a new life and increase self-sufficiency for themselves and their families. Project Connect occurs once a month in a different valley city. Volunteers act as guides to connect individuals seeking help with key resources.

Rooms normally filled with Sunday School students served as makeshift hair salons and clothing stores, and a small chapel became a resource center filled with information about organizations and homeless service providers. Department of Motor Vehicles representatives made Identification Cards and a bicycle repair station provided bike tune-ups. The Dial

Shower Power Trailer, [Tempe Leadership Class 25's Class Project](#), was on-site to provide warm showers.

Homelessness impacts our entire community, with thousands of individuals experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County on any given day, and many at risk after experiencing a job loss, medical cost or foreclosure. Project Connect is a big part of a regional solution to end homelessness. It is a national model which changes individual lives and the community as a whole.

TEMPE FIREFIGHTERS RESTORE AGING GRILL AT HOLLIS PARK



In the 1960s, [Tempe firefighters](#) built grills at [Tempe Beach](#), [Hollis](#), [Jaycee](#) and [Daley](#) parks under the direction of firefighters Charlie Burleson and Burt Hollis as a way to give back to the community.

During the last few weeks, Tempe Fire Department Captain Phil Golosewski and Fire Engineer Robin Kwiatkowski have been demolishing the old grill at [Hollis Park](#) and preparing the foundation for the new concrete work and grill.

“Rebuilding this grill allows us to give back to the community,” said Tempe Fire Department Captain Phil Golosewski. “It’s a part of the Tempe Fire Department’s history, and restoring it honors the legacy of our partnership with the community.”

RING IN THE NEW YEAR AT MILL AVENUE'S NEW CELEBRATION


Mill Avenue in Tempe will be completely open for business this [New Year's Eve](#) – a new twist for the state's most popular place to ring in the new year. Revelers and families are invited to come out for an evening of responsible celebration.



For the first time in many years, there will be no gates around Mill Avenue, no admission fee and no street closures around downtown Tempe on Dec. 31. Area restaurants and nightclubs will be offering entertainment and extended premises for the night. The city and [Downtown Tempe Community](#) are partnering with [Radio Disney](#) for family entertainment from 6 – 9 p.m. on a stage on Seventh Street, west of Mill Avenue. Children's activities and a variety of food trucks also will be in the area.

At 9:30 p.m., dance-pop duo S.O.S. takes over with their energetic combination of party rock and hip-hop. Bluegrass/Americana/ Folk-pop outfit Jared & The Mill begin at 11 p.m. and take us through the countdown to 2013 at midnight.

Two fireworks shows will help announce the coming of 2013. At 9 p.m., an early show will allow kids and families to partake in the annual tradition of New Year's Eve, while adults can witness the 12 a.m. fireworks show officially celebrating Arizona's strike of midnight.
