For 40 years the city of Tempe and the Tempe Union High School District have joined in an exhibition of visual art from the high schools in the Tempe District. More than 3,000 Tempe students participate in fine art classes throughout the district.

This year, more than 100 students exhibit their work at the Edna Vihel Activity Center lobby gallery. The exhibition includes a variety of media including photography, painting, drawing, digital art and ceramics.

This annual exhibition gives audiences a sampling of some of the talented students and engaging programs happening in Tempe schools. This year students' work is displayed in new frames purchased in conjunction with donations from Jerry's Artarama of Tempe, Tempe Artists Guild and the city of Tempe through a Municipal Arts Commission grant.
