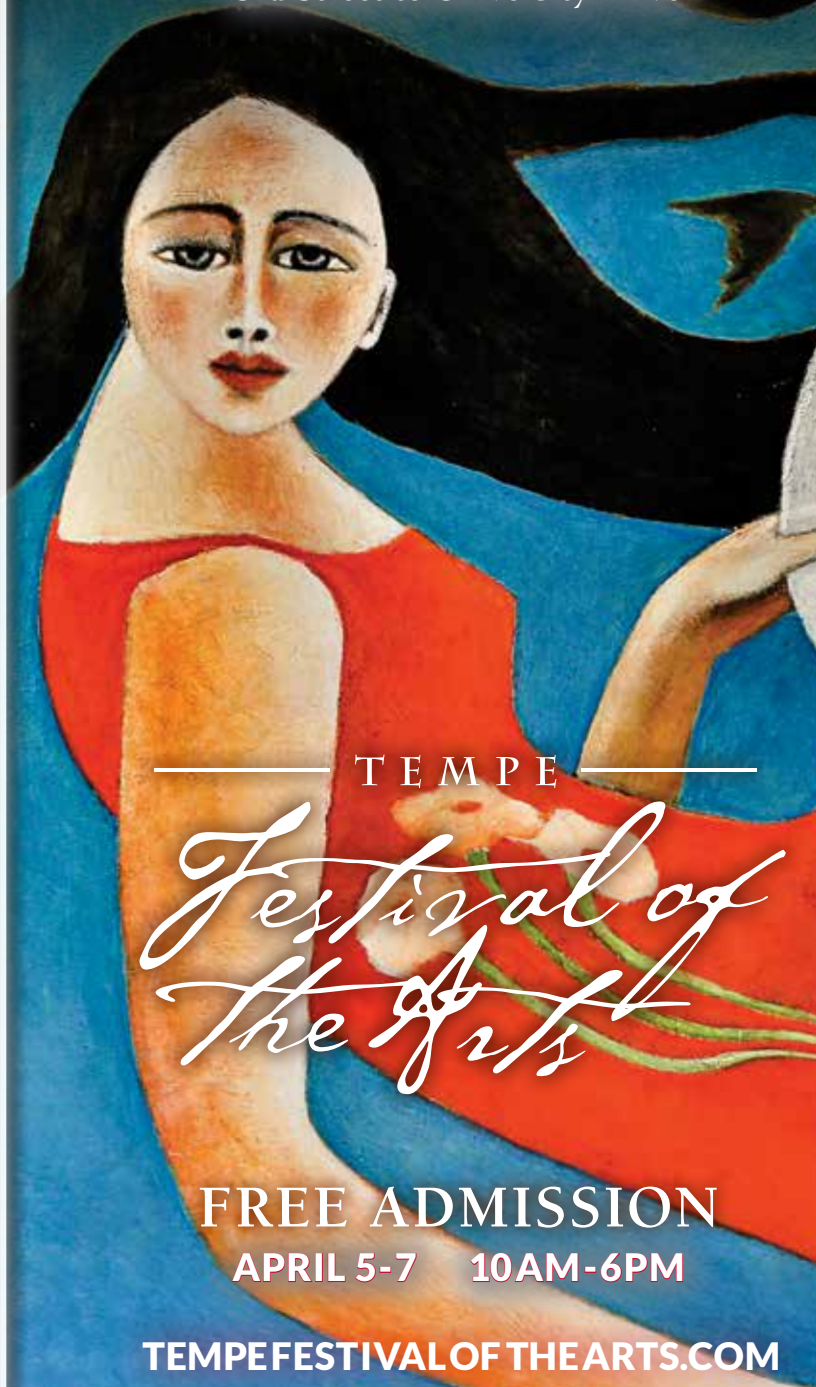

## 36TH SPRING TEMPE FESTIVAL OF THE ARTS

Arizona's finest art and craft show and a beloved Valley tradition for 36 years, the 2013 Spring Tempe Festival of the Arts is poised to welcome more than 375 artisans and host as many as 225,000 visitors during its three days on Mill Avenue in Downtown Tempe. In addition to art and craft, the Festival also features Festival Stage entertainment, Kids Innovation Station hands-on visual arts and crafts, street entertainers, fun festival food, the Arizona Wine Festival gardens, and The Art of Beer microbrewery gardens. Held semi-annually, the Tempe Festival of the Arts' spring show varies from its sister show held in the fall. The spring show is slightly smaller and offers more variety of street entertainment.

The event features:

**ORIGINAL ART MASTERPIECES** More than 375 visual artists from across North America will present their original art ranging from woodwork to ceramics, from photography to wearable art, from painting to jewelry---along with other traditional and non-traditional forms, too. Nothing is mass produced; everything is made by the artists who are on hand to greet you.

**FEATURED ARTIST** Join Armando Adrian-Lopez (Abiquiu, New Mexico), painter and 3-dimensional mixed media artist, at the Featured Artist Booth located at 5th and Mill Avenue at the Festival. The Festival has chosen his painting "Maria de las Golondrinas" as our Featured Art for the spring festival, for promotional use and commemorative poster sales.
