

Art 6: Tempe Union High School District

Student Exhibition; March 11 - May 18, 2011

For 38 years the city of Tempe and the Tempe Union High School District joined together for an exhibition of visual art from the high schools in the Tempe District.

This year, 125 students exhibit their work at the Edna Vihel Activity Center lobby gallery. The exhibition includes a variety of media including photography, painting, drawing, digital art and ceramics.

More than 3,000 Tempe students participate in fine art classes in the district. This annual exhibition gives audiences a sampling of some of the talented students and engaging programs happening in Tempe schools.

In the early years, this exhibition was displayed at the Edna Vihel Center and then moved to the Tempe Public Library. This year, the exhibition has returned to the Vihel Center.
