Theatre as a Second Language

Arizona Theatre Company's *Theatre as a Second Language* residencies use a sequential menu of theatre arts topics to provide students with an understanding of the art of theatre, and use dramatic literature as a catalyst to inspire creativity with tools to develop language literacy, communication skills, artistic engagement, problem solving, critical thinking and informed cultural identity. The five to seven day residencies will be offered during the 2017-18 school year to 6th-8th grades at **Fees College Preparatory** and **Esperanza Preparatory/Maricopa County Regional School**, 9th-12th grades at **Compadre Academy**. What makes the project unique is the curriculums are delivered in English Language Arts classrooms as a counterpart to the Theatre Arts programs offered during the school day or afterschool. Residencies culminate with original staged readings written and performed by the students.

This multidisciplinary arts program is specifically designed for early childhood education and is the only one of its kind for this age group.

Teachers will be given pre-show activities to prepare students for their theatre experience, and parents will be provided with discussion points to continue the learning experience after the show. Tempe Schools & Tetra String Quartet Residency Project

In collaboration with the Tetra String Quartet, a local professional chamber music ensemble, the orchestras of **Marcos de Niza** and **Tempe High** will develop musical/interpersonal skills and apply them in and out of the classroom. Students will form small ensembles and independently prepare pieces, receive instruction from Tetra, and perform multiple community concerts at **Friendship Village** and the **Tempe History Museum** (including concerts for children with autism). Through practicing these values, young musicians will develop life skills that are relevant beyond their high school orchestra experience. 



This project will introduce contact improvisation as a bonding activity between a child and a significant adult figure in their life-whether a parent, grandparent, sibling, or mentor. Contact Improvisation is a partner dance form based on the physical principles of touch, momentum, shared weight, and maintaining continuous contact. There will be a series of 3 community workshops held in three different communal spaces in Tempe, culminating in a final 'dance party' that all participants are invited to attend.



SCHOOL ARTS GRANTS

Aguilar Elementary School

Aguilar Elementary School received funds to produce a concert for second grade students. In the winter students will sing, audition for solos, memorize dance parts, and learn speaking parts. The purpose of this project is to enhance the understanding of different genres of music. Students will be introduced to music by a jazz quartet and a hip-hop workshop in February.

Compadre Academy

Dan Abbott from Tempe Empty Bowls will come to the school and give a presentation to the art classes on Art and Social Action. Compadre students will make bowls and other ceramic wares for donation to the 2018 Tempe Empty Bowls event in February. This will be a kick off event for the Compadre Art Club, open to any and all Compadre and ASU Preparatory Academy students. Students will be introduced to basic ceramics principles and taught techniques to create a hand built bowl, as well as surface decoration techniques to finish the vessel or sculpture.

Fees College Preparatory Middle School

The Fine Arts Department will produce Seussical Jr. The musical will take place from December 6th-December 8th and will involve 50+ students. The purpose of this musical project is to give students valuable experience in putting on a professional production. Participating students become familiar with in a variety of fields including, but not limited to: production, design, stage/prop creation, special effects, dancing, and of course, acting and singing.

Fees College Preparatory Middle School

The Guitar Program at Fees College Preparatory Middle School will expand their programming by purchasing additional equipment, and allowing more students to participate in their guitar programs. Students in the program explore guitar, history, culture, and performance by giving students the opportunity to learn, practice, and perform.



Kyrene Middle School

Students will learn how to use all of the different percussion instruments available at Kyrene Middle School from Travis Rowland, a professional Phoenix-based percussionist. 15 student percussionists, grades 6-8, will participate in 2 clinics to expand students percussion interest beyond drums including marimba, xylophone, vibraphone, timpani, chimes, and maracas.

Laird Middle School

The orchestra and band classes will expand their music library, allowing students to have the same exposure to quality ensemble music as other middle schools in Tempe. Students will have a larger variety of music to perform, and will learn more skill sets by performing new music every year.

Marcos de Niza High School

Marcos de Niza High School will develop a student-run gallery at their school. The gallery will provide students an opportunity to not only display their work, but to design, set, and publicize student organized shows on a quarterly basis.

Rover Elementary School

Rover Elementary School will expand their musical theatre program by purchasing additional wireless audio equipment. This will make productions easier to hear, and provide the student actors with freedom to move as they speak. The 40+ students in the play work hard to learn their lines, and deserve the reward of having them heard and understood.

Tempe High School

Tempe High School's Art Club will work with professional local artist, Jake Early, to create a permanent mural on their campus. The students will experience the connection between the artists and where they live.

Tempe Preparatory Academy
