Suggested materials list for Watercolor Painting

- Paint (in tubes)

Cadmium yellow light	Ultramarine blue	Yellow ochre
Cadmium red light	Prussian blue	Burnt sienna
Alizarin crimson	Sap green	Raw umber
Permanent rose	Phthalo green	
- Brushes
 - Flat, ¾ inch, synthetic
 - This brush will have a short handle. Loew-Cornell, Artec or Winsor & Newton suggested.
 - Round – at least #6.
- Paper: 130# or better. Strathmore 400 series is good to begin with.
- Palette: also called a slant. Be sure it is a watercolor palette with the spaces and a large mixing area.
- Water containers: please bring two
- Small squirt bottle
- Sponge: either natural or synthetic.
- Rags or paper towels: if you prefer your own. We have paper towels in class.
- Pencil (HB or softer) and eraser (kneaded or plastic).
- Suggested but not required: a small set of watercolor pencils to draw on the paper.
