

# Tempe Public Art Opportunity

## Bicycle Lane Symbols

---

Tempe Public Art announces a public art opportunity for an artist to design bicycle lane symbols. The selected artist will design a series of bicycle lane symbols to be installed on Tempe bikeways throughout the city beginning with University Drive and Hardy Drive Streetscape Projects.

Tempe has had a long-standing commitment to encourage bicycling through the development of bikeways. The city's commitment dates back to 1973 when the first Tempe Bicycle Plan was developed. It was the first comprehensive bicycle plan in the state. Since then, there has been a steady expansion of the city's bikeway network.

Tempe has one of the highest percentages of bicycle commuters in the country. Providing good mobility has meant building a bikeway network that spans the city with a high degree of connectivity. Hardy Drive is a connective street providing access and University Drive is a high-volume arterial street providing direct routes. These two streetscape projects are intended to promote neighborhood stability, sustainable business and development efforts while continuing Tempe's commitment to alternative modes of transportation.

### Eligibility

---

Visual artists residing in Arizona are eligible to apply for this public art opportunity. This project is open to professional artists with experience and expertise in any two-dimensional media including painting, drawing, printmaking, digital art and more. Emerging artists are encouraged to apply.

Accepted artist will be required by Arizona State Law HB 2008 to sign a statement verifying that they are lawfully present in the United States. City of Tempe employees, selection panelists, Tempe Municipal Arts Commission Members, City of Tempe volunteers, and their immediate family members are excluded from participating in this project.

### Budget

---

Design of Bicycle Lane Symbols – \$2,500  
Budget covers artist fees, design, travel and public meeting presentations. The artist is not responsible for the costs associated with the fabrication or installation of the bike lane symbols.

## How to Apply

---

The entire submission should be sent as one PDF file including all submittal materials listed below. Specific proposals are not requested at this stage in the process and will not be accepted.

- **Letter of Intent:** (Maximum 1 page) Describe why you are interested in a bicycle lane symbols project and relevant past experience.
- **Resume:** (Maximum 2 pages) Please include your address, email address and telephone number.
- **Images:** Five images of recent related work. Specific proposals will not be accepted.
- **Image List:** (Maximum 2 pages) A separate document providing information about the images. For each image submitted list the title, date, media, size, site, budget and a thumbnail of the image.

## Artist Selection Panel

---

Artist Selection Panel will review artists' images and written materials to select one artist. The panel may recommend alternate artists for this project. Artist Selection Panel is comprised of community stakeholders, neighborhood representatives and associated city staff.

## Tempe Public Art

---

The Tempe Public Art was established in 1988 and commissions a mixture of quality temporary and permanent projects that complements the natural and built environment. Tempe Public Art continues to implement new initiatives and commission artwork that engages our community.
