Mothers and mother figures shape the minds and spirits of people all over the world. From the womb to the last breath, mothers can be found in hearts and thoughts (whether welcome or not).


The Mothers Exhibition was inspired by motherhood and first appeared at the Shemer Art Center earlier this year as 12 artists took on the task of interpreting
