NEUTER SCOOTER

The **Maricopa County Neuter Scooter** and **Anti-Cruelty Response Unit** is a self-contained surgical unit that offers spay neuter surgeries, low-cost vaccine clinics, license and microchip clinics for Maricopa County residents who are in need. It also serves as MCACC's response unit in cases of animal cruelty and neglect. The Neuter Scooter will be at the **Escalante Community Center** [2150 E. Orange St. near University Dr. + Price Rd.] on Saturday, 28 June from 7 - 10AM. The first 150 healthy pets get a no-cost rabies vaccination on a first come, first served basis. A no-cost rabies vaccination clinic as well as purchased dog licenses will also be available.
