PLAY LIKE A KID AGAIN AT TEMPE PLAYDAY 2012

In keeping with its designation as a Playful City USA community for the third consecutive year, Tempe will host a free day of play for kids of all ages to celebrate play and reap the benefits of being active. [PlayDay](#) will be Saturday, Feb. 18, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. at [Kiwanis Park](#), Mill Avenue and All-America Way.

Come out and join the fun. There will be plenty of structured and unstructured games and events, including: kayaking, football, softball and tennis drills and skills, inflatable games, dance and movement classes and more! All activities will take place on and around Kiwanis Lake.

[KaBOOM!](#), a national non-profit organization dedicated to promoting play in children's lives, chose Tempe as a Playful City USA community this past summer. In the fifth year of the program, KaBOOM! named 151 cities and towns across the country – 11 of which are in Arizona – as Playful City USA honorees. Tempe was given this designation for the third consecutive year because of the way it uses play and play spaces to positively impact childhood wellness, public safety and quality of life.

"KaBOOM's recognition of Tempe as a play-friendly city is a great validation of the efforts of residents, City employees and community organizations to make outdoor spaces and recreational

opportunities a priority," said Mayor Hugh Hallman.


INAUGURAL POLAR PLUNGE A “FREEZING” SUCCESS!

Assistant Recreation Coordinator at the Kyrene de la Mariposa Elementary School, King works tirelessly to make sure children are provided with an after-school home away from home.

King was recently recognized for his accomplishments at The [Arizona Center for Afterschool Excellence’s Spotlight on Afterschool Excellence Awards](#). He received the award for Outstanding Afterschool Professional for his commitment to all 140 of his KidZone students. Having worked in the before- and after-school area for over 12 years, King knows the importance of such programs. He serves

close to 175 families throughout the week and works to “create memorable childhood experiences for every student, every day.”

The KidZone enrichment program that provides before and after-school programming for children in Pre-School through 8th grade is available in 19 Tempe and Kyrene schools.
