### **Fantasy of Lights Opening Night Parade Saturday, Nov. 24**

Help kick off the holiday season at the annual [Fantasy of Lights Opening Night Parade](#) on Saturday, Nov. 24. Set amid the glittering lights of the festively decorated shops and restaurants of the Mill Avenue District, the free parade will step off at Third Street and Mill Avenue at 6 p.m. and will conclude with Santa arriving to hear gift requests from children.



### **Tempe Festival of the Arts Friday - Sunday, Nov. 30 - Dec. 2**

Visit Mill Avenue between Third Street and University Drive from Friday through Sunday, Nov. 30 - Dec. 2, to experience the [44th annual Fall Tempe Festival of the Arts](#), Arizona's finest art and craft show and an award-winning holiday tradition ideal for the whole family. Browse and buy original arts and crafts that make for one-of-a-kind gifts and enjoy entertainment, street performers, exhibits and more. Children can create their own masterpieces to take home at the free Kids Innovation Station, and adults can relax in the Arizona Wine Festival and The Art of Beer microbrewery gardens. The festival is open from 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. each day and admission is free.

Take the kids and grandkids to visit with Santa at Tempe Beach Park at 6 p.m. Then, at 7 p.m., the parade will begin with as many as 61 festively decorated and lighted boats of all sizes floating down the lake. The parade is the only time of the year when motorized vessels are allowed on Town Lake. The [11th annual Larry Campbell Tree of Lights](#) will shine once again this holiday season to help support the Tempe History Museum's oral history program and honor or remember those you hold dear.

The fundraising program is presented by the Tempe Historical Society and is named for a past president of the Society who began the tradition. By achieving the accreditation from the [National Accreditation Commission for Early Care and Education Programs](#), Kid Zone Preschool provides parents a program that has exceeded state licensing requirements and professional development opportunities for staff.

"Our Kid Zone preschool program establishes early learning standards for

our students in an environment that is safe and nurturing," said Rosemary Amature, Kid Zone Preschool Director. "We provide them with the fine and gross motor skills, educational curriculum and the social and emotional development needed to move to kindergarten."

The Kid Zone Preschool program is offered year-round at Getz School. In its fourth year, the program enrolls more than 75 students annually, ages 2 through Pre-Kindergarten.

The City of Tempe will hold a series of open houses to gather resident feedback related to needs for mobility and accessibility within, around and through Tempe for the [Transportation Master Plan \(TMP\)](#). The TMP provides the policy basis for how transportation funding is spent, and what projects or programs the city focuses on to provide transportation services for its citizens through the year 2040.

The plan will include elements related to streets, pedestrian facilities, bikeways, transit and high-capacity options (freeways and rail). The community is invited to attend an open house to provide input on Wednesday, Nov. 28 from 6-7:30 p.m. at the Tempe Transportation Center's [Don Cassano Community Room](#) or Saturday, Dec. 1 from 9:30-11 a.m. at the [Tempe History Museum](#).
