



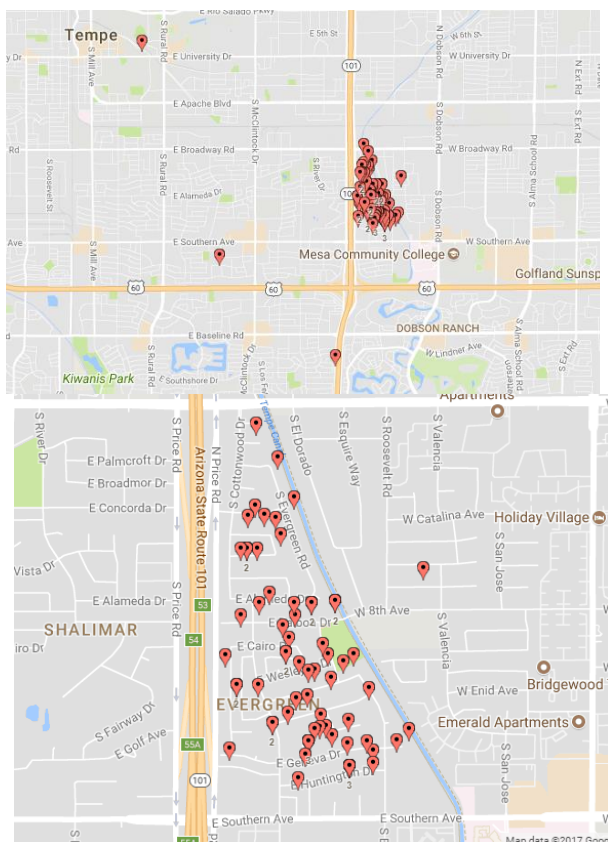
PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY

Overview

A public meeting was held on November 4th to get feedback on planned improvements for Daumler Park. Residents in the area of Southern to Broadway, Price to the Tempe Canal (574 households) were invited to participate in the process via postcard. Notices were also posted on Nextdoor directing residents to the meeting as well as the website. 14 residents signed in at the meeting, but more residents were present in the park to look over the plans. Surveys were available at the meeting and online from November 4, extended through November 26, 2017. A total of 67 survey responses were received; 14 at the meeting and 53 online.

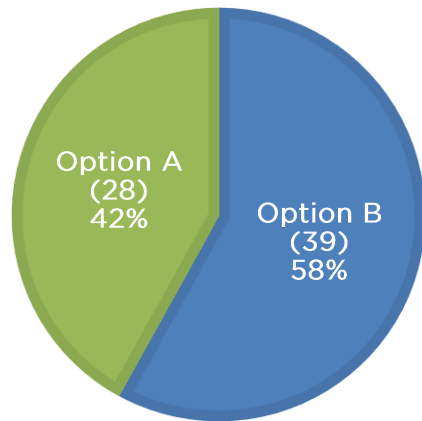
The proposed designs included different placements of amenities and residents were asked to provide comments on playground equipment layout, ramada finishes, and the placement of the playground shade.

Map of Survey Responses:

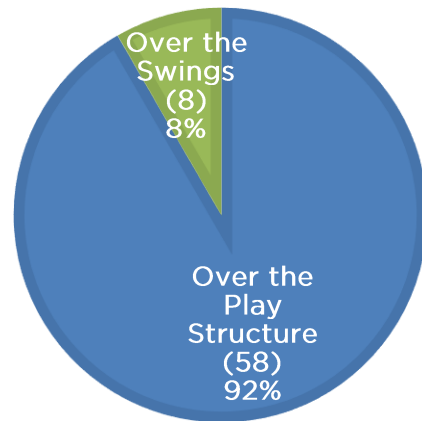


Survey Responses

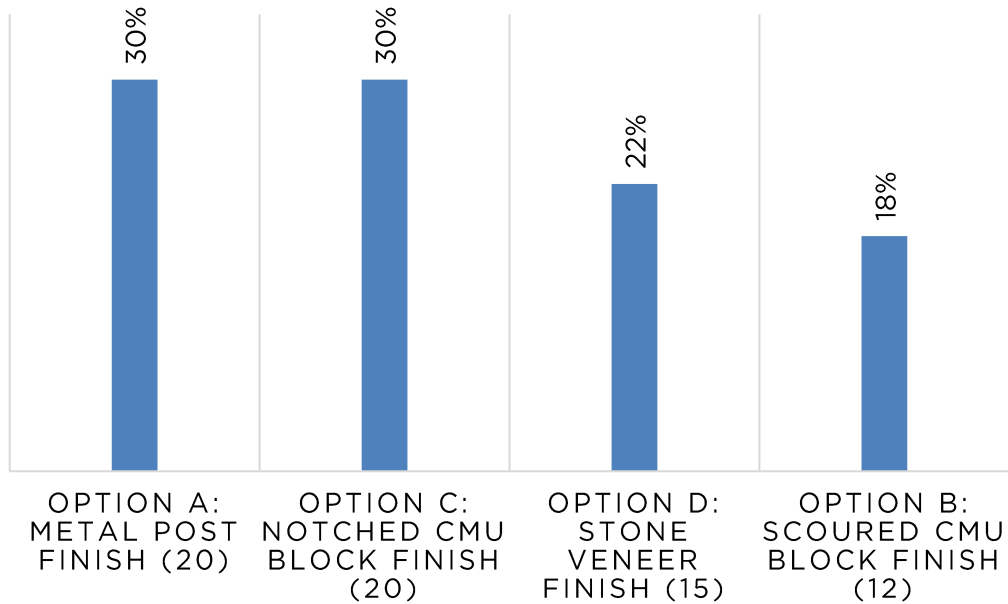
1. Which play structure for ages 5-12 do you prefer?

4. Additional Comments:

1. Metal post Ramada will be easier to maintain against graffiti; prefer metal to be painted a neutral color/tan or gray to blend. I was happy to hear that the Ramada will have the capability for power to use for inflatables, amplifiers, etc. In playground: disappointed that there will be only two regular swings; play area B seems to have much more for the kids "to do"; climbing structures, sway bridge, etc. Would like to see as many benches as possible stay around the playground for parents. On the diagram it looks like we'd be losing current benches. Also sad to see the swing bench go. Kids and parents enjoyed it. It needed to be better maintained though, starting to rust, and loud, squeaking chains. General area: I heard that more trees will be added, which is great, but please leave enough open field for sports: football, baseball, soccer. The grass and (soon to be gone) sand both have a bad ant infestation, please spray for pests.
2. Concerned about graffiti on ramada posts
3. Thank you! The bench swing is really useful.
4. Option A with a sway bridge would be good. I would love more shade and a cheaper ramada column material. My kids really enjoy the bench swing, as do adults, could we keep that? Can we keep the tire swing on option B?
5. For #3, do what is less expensive and use savings to put coverings over BOTH play areas (ie/ swings). Put dunk hoops in basketball court.
6. Shorten baskets on basketball court for younger kids to play easier (6ft). Covering over both swings AND play structure.
7. I liked both of them but I really liked that spinner.
8. On a hot day swings are much easier to wipe down and cool off than entire play structure, so for sure the shade needs to be over the structure.
9. How about some pull up bars at adult and kid heights and maybe some dip bars or monkey bars for adults.
10. We are very excited for the playground renovations. I wish I had given input earlier, it's my own fault that I didn't, but I'm glad to take the opportunity now. I would have loved for there to have been both a play structure for 5-12 year olds and one for the 2-5 age range, but I see that wasn't the general consensus. I LOVE Rotary Park that's just the other side of the 101 because it has great activities for a wider range of ages making it a great option for play groups, or families like mine with a young toddler and a child old enough for the "big kid" equipment. With that said, I chose Option A for the play ground structure because it does seem to be a bit friendlier for appealing to a wider age range. I would love to see things that both my children (ages 1 and 4) could play on. I also see that toddler swings weren't one of the top choices, but is it possible for one of the swings in the dome swing apparatus to be a baby/toddler swing? Again, I realize that I dropped the ball by not responding earlier, but better late than never, right?
11. We would also really like to see toddler swings in the mix with the bigger kid swings.
