

El Paso Path Public Input Summary



OVERVIEW

Public meetings were held on Wednesday, Oct. 16 and Saturday, Oct. 19, 2019 to collect feedback on the refined draft designs for scheduled El Paso Path expansion and improvements, including expanding the path through Optimist Park, lighting replacement and upgrades to landscaping with concrete improvements.

Eighteen attendees signed in at the Oct. 16 meeting and 20, including 5 that also attended the Oct. 16 meeting, at the Oct. 19 meeting. A total of 19 survey responses were received; 11 at the Oct. 16 meeting, 3 at the Oct. 20 meeting and 5 online.

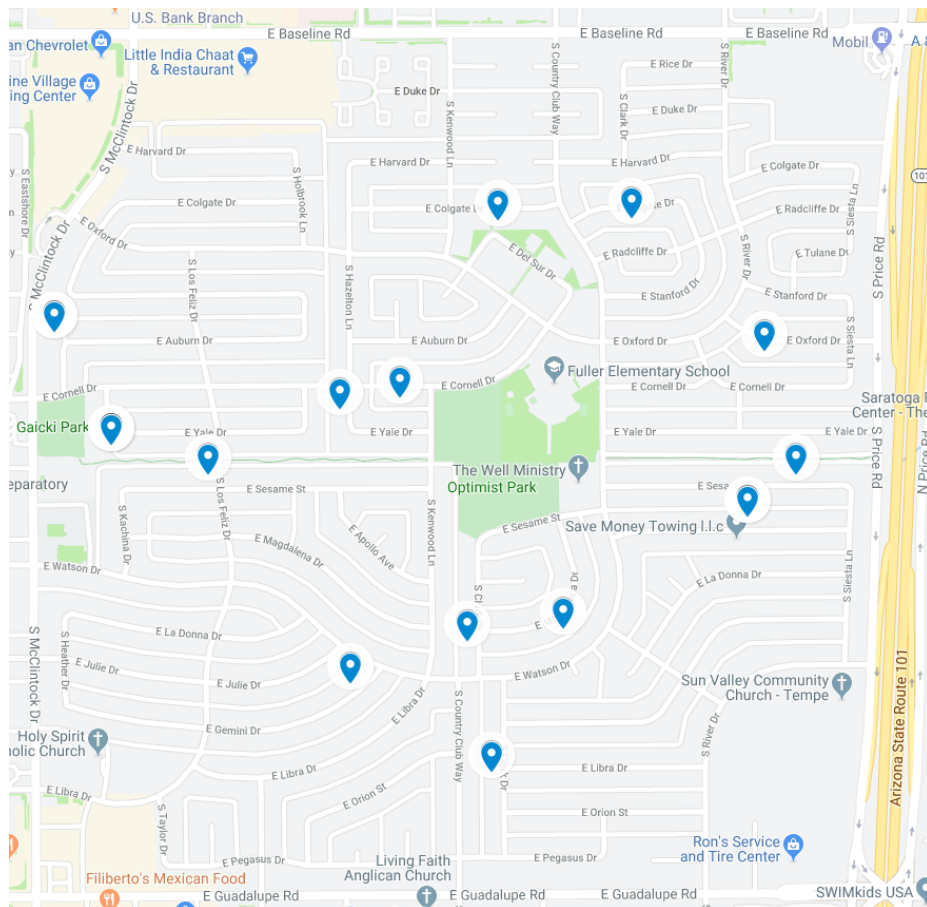
OUTREACH

Residents in the area of McClintock Drive to Price Road and Baseline Road to Guadalupe Road were invited to participate in the process through direct mail, with additional outreach done through Nextdoor and area neighborhood and homeowners' associations.

Nextdoor Oct. 23 comment reminder post: 130 impressions

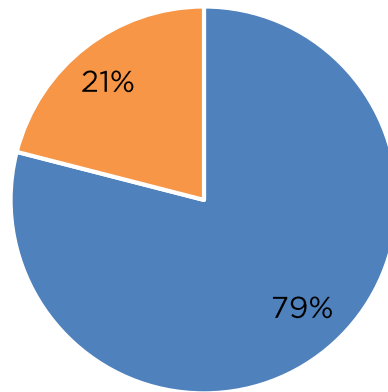
MAP OF SURVEY RESPONDENTS



SURVEY RESPONSES

1. Based on the feedback received on the conceptual design, benches and trash cans are proposed to be added in the following three locations: 1. just east of Country Club Way on the path; 2. along the path in the section in Optimist Park and 3. at the western end of the path near Gaicki Park.

2. Did we miss anything in the refined draft design?

1. Nope, but I am really excited to see this plan completed!
2. Remove 2 lamps from design. No bench. Move sidewalk south, add vegetation on north if possible. Move lamp to west behind tree. Delete and remove lamps by Gaicki Park path entrance.
3. No, looks great!
4. Great job, please improve Rural to McClintock.
5. Can you add 1/4 inch minus decomposed granite to the drive section on the north side? Always getting gravel in my shoes and may need to walk in that area sometimes for shade when extra hot. Can you add a covered bulletin board for neighbors?
6. Definitely add shields to lights and move west as noted on plan.
7. Shield and move location of lights behind 5630 as marked on plan.
8. No, the plans look great.
9. No, I think it looks good. I look forward to completion.

10. The project looks wonderful. I can't stress enough that it only going to be as good as the maintenance. Please give it every consideration.
11. Would it be possible to paint house numbers on the back fence of the homes?
12. To reduce the amount of handbills taped to light poles, could we have a couple of covered bulletin boards. Lit? Might reduce maintenance or at least make it easier to clean up paper posts.
13. Please do not put any cacti or red bird of paradise on the accent areas in path entrances.
14. Dog stations. Take one leave one are ugly and no trash can. Bags left blow around, can we get official stations with biodegradable bags and attached trash cans? Thanks!
