- 4) Quarterly PHX East Compliance Report;** Quarter 2 2025 Report and presentation by Jacob Payne, for discussion.

Mr. Jacob Payne gave a presentation on the Quarter 2, 2025 Phoenix Compliance Report. Air traffic volumes were a little lower than last quarter. Last quarter there were a total of 58,000 flights. This quarter there was a

total of 56,000. Noise complaints to the City of Tempe were also less this quarter. Mr. Payne stated about 95% of those complaints came from one person. The claims from the City of Phoenix were in the ballpark of range from last quarter. The City of Tempe does plan to reach out to the one individual. City of Phoenix received 580 complaints and 577 of them were from one person.

5) Commissioners Business; suggestions for future agenda items.

Commissioner Mitnik stated that there is another way to better understand what is going on with air traffic control. All Commissioners should visit the website called Liveatc.net. You can enter an air traffic control code, enter PHX. That gives you the opportunity to listen to air traffic control live. I recommend everyone select the Biltmore sector. It also handles Scottsdale traffic. Scottsdale Airport is the busiest single runway airport in the United States.

The Commission discussed the tour at Sky Harbor.

Commissioner Mitnik asked if any past presentations are public information and can be published? Mr. Payne stated that these meetings re public and any information shared in them becomes public.

Vice Chair Camargo stated he drafted a thank letter to Mr. Matt Shorman who hosted the Sky Harbor tour.

Chair Carraway stated that next month we will have an update from Mr. Jordan Feld and an update on the progress made on a resolution with the two individuals placing noise complaints.

Vice Chair Camargo would like to discuss the new time and location of the meetings. Does it work for everyone?

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Tempe Transportation Plan 2050 is an update of the 2015 Tempe Transportation Master Plan. The goal for this update is to provide a multi-modal transportation guide for the City that equitably addresses Tempe's current and anticipated transportation needs. This plan will build upon the goals and priorities established in the Tempe Tomorrow: General Plan 2050, ADA Improvement Plan, MAG Regional Transportation Plan and other similar documents and highlight opportunities within the City's transportation network. The update is currently in its first project phase, Understanding. This first phase aims to collect and understand data related to current conditions and future needs, and community feedback.
