Steve Yamamori – Maricopa Community College Foundation Veterans Initiatives

Maricopa Community College Foundation will be launching the Veterans' Success Project, a multimillion dollar campaign to support veterans. An event will be held at Gateway Community College on December 3rd. They are also working in conjunction with East Valley Veteran's Center to build a West Valley Veteran's Center to assure that there are resources for all veterans valley wide. The Foundation would be interested in a member of the Veteran's Commission to be on their Advisory Committee.

Ed Logan, Retired Air Force – President of ASU Alumni Veterans' Chapter and Multi-Association Veg Chapter; Vice President of Luke AFB Air Force Association

Mr. Logan recently joined the Tempe Chamber of Commerce Military Affairs Committee. He provided the Commission with handouts on a memorial being built for 30+ Arizona State University Sun Devils who have died at war. Fundraising has begun; Challenge Coins are available online. There will be an Honors Stole Ceremony in which all graduating ASU veterans will be honored on December 14, 2015. Mr. Logan expressed interest in the vacant seat on the Commission, and submitted a completed application.

Mario Aguirre – Arizona Coalition for Military Families

Mario Aguirre is representing Thomas Winkel, and will be replacing his seat on the Commission. Commission will be attending navigation training. City of Tempe is recognized as Veteran's Employer supportive city. He can provide a list of all Tempe businesses that have completed Veteran's Employer Supportive Training.

Item 6 – Troy Friedman - East Valley “Stand Up” Event

The East Valley “Stand Up” event is tentatively scheduled for April 2, 2016. The event will be focused on employment. The East Valley Veteran’s Center is working in conjunction with Glendale Community College and Rio Salado for a \$5,000 grant to support the event. There was interest in expanding to other East Valley cities, i.e. Mesa, Gilbert, and Chandler. Commissioner Friedman is taking the lead on “Stand Up”. Publicity could be generated in January with the launch of the website. There is an organizational meeting tentatively scheduled for January 13, 2016.
